This term we will be focusing on the following writing topics:

We are Historians

This term children will be learning the skills and knowledge to become historians.

As historians, our main historical focus will be about our local area, Lancaster during the slave trade era.

From this point of study, children will understand about black history and human rights.

We are Geographers

This term children will be learning the skills and knowledge to become Geographers.

Children will learn how to map the world, understand time zones, climate, biomes and vegetation belts. With a greater focus on the 3 areas of the transatlantic slave trade (UK, Africa and America), children will compare different landscapes and landmarks that which make these areas individual. Children will also understand the historical geography with reference to trade and economy.

<u>RE</u>

Exodus: Children will be given a greater understanding of the significance of the Exodus and Passover.

The Eucharist: Year 6 will identify links between the Passover meal, Last Supper and Eucharist.

Jesus: This unit will allow children the opportunity to stand back and consider "Who was Jesus" and Who is Jesus?"

Through practical investigations, children will use and interpret circuits and diagrams. They will compare and give reasons for variations in how components function.

During our Wednesday music lessons, children will be focusing on the themes: "A New Year Carol" and "You've Got a Friend".
