How you can help your child at home Reading

We are Historians (The ancient Greeks)

The significant person we are studying is Alexander the Great.

Our overall themes will be:

Greece locality study

Geographical features

Hierarchy

Government

Roles in society

Sometimes History can be grisly...

All areas will be taught sensitively, but if you think your child may need more support with this, please let me know.

We are Scientists (States of matter)

Compare and group materials together according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases.

Solids, liquids and gases can be identified by their observable properties.

Solids have a fixed size and shape.

Liquids can pour and take the shape of a container.

Liquids form a pool not a pile.

Gases fill the container in which they are put.

Gases can be made smaller by squeezing/pressure.

Liquids and gases can flow.

RE (Jesus)

Deepen the children's understanding of Jesus: who he was, his teaching and behaviour.

Use the events covered in the stories in this unit to illustrate and emphasise the Christian belief that Jesus is the Son of God; that he was God and man, both human and divine.

Deepen pupil's knowledge and understanding of why the sabbath, Shabbat, is so important to Jews.

Introduce the celebrations and traditions of Jewish Shabbat.

RE (Easter)

Give children the opportunity to reflect upon the importance of power and the effect of betrayal, trust and forgiveness.

Deepen pupil's understanding of the concept of salvation.

Focus on the significance of the incidents of betrayal and trust in the Easter story.
